3GIS Telecommunications Amendment to Network Plan for the ACT

I refer to your letter of 9 August 2007 on behalf of 3GIS Pty Ltd in which the 3GIS Telecommunications Amendment to the Network Plan and its associated Public Consultation Report was submitted for my consideration and decision.

The ACT Planning and Land Authority has undertaken a thorough assessment of the proposed amendment to the Network Plan and Consultation Report under the provisions of the *Authority Guideline for Telecommunications (Mobile Phone) Networks*. - A Licence obtained under Section 217 of the *Land (Planning and Environment) Act 1991*
- A Survey certificate signed by an ACT registered surveyor.

General Advice:

Implementation of the amendment to the Network Plan –

1. Consult with the relevant land managers for advice on the timing of construction works.
2. The following approvals will need to be obtained and forwarded to Asset Acceptance Unit of the ACT Department of Territory and Municipal Services, prior to the commencement of any work on site:
 - Landscape Management Protection Plan (LMP)
 - Notice of Commencement of Construction.
3. Prior to the commencement of construction, a complete set of the drawings for the site is to be submitted to ActewAGL for acceptance.
4. Materials are to be non-reflective, graffiti and vandal proof, and colours to blend with the existing landscape.
